WorkSafeBC's OHS Regulation Part 4.13-4.18 Emergency Preparedness and Response requires employers to provide "adequate instruction in the fire prevention and emergency evacuation (and response) procedures applicable to their workplace." Employers must also ensure that "emergency drills must be held at least once per year to ensure awareness and effectiveness of emergency exit routes and procedures, and a record of the drills must be kept."

WorkSafe BC requires employers and supervisors to be responsible for ensuring all workers are:

- Adequately trained and certified
- Provide direct supervision and correct unsafe acts/conditions
- Ensure only authorized, adequately trained workers operate equipment
- Maintain health and safety standards
