

TDG Transportation of Dangerous Goods

Attention Managers - Health & Safety Supervisors

According to Transportation Canada, employees must be adequately trained and hold a valid training certificate under the *TDG Act 1992; Transportation of Dangerous Goods Regulations up to and including SOR/2008- 34 (Amendment 6)*.

Adequate training definition: A person is adequately trained if the person has a sound knowledge of all the topics listed in the *TDG Act Part 6.2* that relate directly to the person's duties and to the dangerous goods the person is expected to handle, offer for transport, or transport.

WorkSafe BC requires employers and supervisors to be responsible for ensuring all workers are:

- Adequately trained and certified
- Provide direct supervision and correct unsafe acts/conditions
- Ensure only authorized, adequately trained workers operate equipment
- Maintain health and safety standards
